Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for the Saginaw Covenant Academy (KCA). The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Saginaw Covenant Academy has not been given one of these labels.

Saginaw Covenant Academy is now in its seventh year of operation. SCA is an alternative school offering a blended instruction curriculum model. Our students use an online curriculum provider, Edgenuity, and highly-qualified content area teachers to deliver the Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) to our students. One of our key challenges is improving graduation rates. SCA has restricted its education delivery model that focuses on the core curriculum in morning sessions and more focused and targeted invention in the



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afternoon. Data is used to identify those students who are found to have a gap in learning and highly qualified teachers provided direct, targeted instruction.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Saginaw Covenant Academy is a year-round school that has an open enrollment policy. The enrollment process involves completing an enrollment packet, a hearty orientation process in which the student and family are educated on the expectations of all students, and other policies and procedures associated with being a student at KCA.
2. Saginaw Covenant Academy will begin to utilize MiCIP moving forward which incorporates the school improvement plan. Part of the school improvement plan that is being implemented is the restructuring of the academic delivery model which includes targeted intervention and also an Advisory curriculum that focuses on student mindsets which expresses care for all students while challenging growth. More focus will also be placed on preparing students for post-secondary life.
3. Saginaw Covenant Academy provides at-risk, dropout youth ages 16-22, the opportunity to earn a high school diploma, improve their life skills, and continue on to post-secondary education or employment. SCA focuses on youth who are dropouts, homeless, living in poverty, teen parents or expectant parents, and those that have been disenfranchised. Our school works to break down barriers so students have the opportunity to achieve their high school diploma. We offer a blended learning program and flexible, year-round classes that enables us to provide an individualized education for each student which allows them to work at their own pace. Our staff works towards preventing poverty, underachievement, and homelessness for our students, while offering hope, encouragement, and greater opportunities for success.



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- 4. Our students use an online curriculum provider, Edgenuity, and highly-qualified content area teachers to deliver the Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) to our students.

- 6. As a part of its school improvement plan, Saginaw Covenant Academy will begin to hold traditional parent-teacher conferences. Currently, teachers meet with students for one-on-one academic advising sessions which focus on academic progress, progress towards graduation and planning for post-secondary opportunities.
- 7. Saginaw Covenant Academy currently does not have any students that are a part of a dual enrollment program or Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate classes.

In closing, I am proud of the accomplishments of our students and graduates and am encouraged with all of the hard work and dedication of our staff as they work to further the educational goals of our students. We continue to build and implement the best people, systems and culture to graduate students that are successful and contributing citizens of our community.
